Objective:

Interest Approach –

1. Students should read page 2 in the student handbook before completing Activity 1.
2. Just as each part of the model has a specific role to play, so do the characters of the one-minute play each group will produce and perform.

Activity 1 – Parts of a Three-Circle Model

1. Create the name tags before class begins using FFA.OH.1.2.AS.A. These name tags will be worn during presentations.
2. Divide students into groups of three to create a one-minute play to perform for the class.
 - a. Review your expectations for proper conduct.
 - b. Each student should choose the character to be portrayed: Classroom, SAE or FFA. Each character should have dialogue.
3. Provide no more than five minutes for groups to prepare their scripts, organize their thoughts and/or rehearse.
4. Have each group present. *Do not allow groups to exceed one minute; stop their performances at that mark.*
5. Review the characteristics found in each part of the three-circle model by allowing students to identify the differences they saw in the characters.

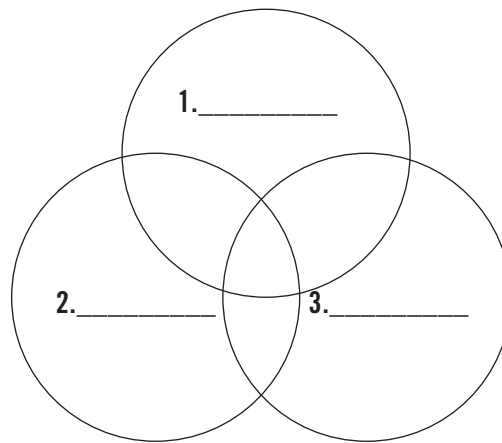
